1. Call to Order

5. Clinical Hub Update

Jennie Helmer introduced Rob Evans and Ford Smith to present on the BCEHS Clinical Hub. The Clinical Hub was founded in January 2022 because of increased system pressure, with approximately 66,000 patient contacts since launch. A recent highlight was being awarded the Health Care Innovation Team Award 2024 by the Canadian College of Health Leaders.

Additional information was provided in response to Board members' questions:

- First Nations Health Authority has been involved in discussions regarding inclusion of the Doctor of the Day service.
- Patient satisfaction is tracked through patient experience surveys and focus groups. Clinicians explain to patients why they are being streamed and all decisions are made in conjunction with patients. Patients may be provided with a range of supportive options.
- We use a two-triage system, initially doing a quick assessment to look for life-threatening complaints, then look for sub-determinants as part of a secondary triage system. As calls proceed through the secondary triage queue, we start to identify alternate pathways.
- Approximately 15% of above-Yellow Clinical Response Model events are assessed virtually by Secondary Triage Clinicians.
- We are looking at data for reduction in carbon emissions and can also provide data estimates of the amount of time saved by not transporting patients.
